The Sandhills Motoring Festival for 2021 is right around the corner! After a tumultuous 2020, SMF is finally taking place in the heart of the historic Village of Pinehurst, May 28th through 30, Memorial Day Weekend. The events are already starting to sell out and the entrants are eager to attend the one of kind Concours in the Village. SMF Weekend kicks off Friday night with an Informal Car Show and BBQ at the Pine Crest Inn, located in the heart of Pinehurst and formerly owned by golf legend Donald Ross. Saturday starts off with the SMF Road Rally which pits entrants against a very tough hunt through the country roads of Moore County. Also taking place Saturday morning, is the Pottery Highway tour, which will visit Ben Owen Pottery, along with other local potteries through the Seagrove, NC area. Saturday evening brings the SMF Hangar Party, taking place with refreshments and entertainment at the Moore County Airport's Main Hangar.

Sunday is the main event - the "Concours in the Village" which will feature over 125 automobiles in sixteen classes, along with special display cars from Foreign Cars Italia, and other private collections. The historic streets of the Village serve as the backdrop to this event and spectators will be in for a treat while practicing safe measures and social distancing. SMF is also boasting the new Car Club Showcase with over 80 cars less than two blocks away from the main event across from the Pinehurst Brewery. Transportation services will be available courtesy of SMF sponsors. Awards will be announced at 2pm with both show fields clearing after 3pm. Sunday evening caps off the weekend at the renown Country Club of North Carolina (CCNC) in Pinehurst for the Awards Banquet Dinner.

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A SIXTY-FOUR YEAR LOVE AFFAIR

This love story began in 1955, when Jack Van Stavern, a 25-year-old Army Captain from West Virginia, was stationed in Munich, Germany. That was the first time that he had ever laid eyes on the 1938 Mercedes-Benz 170V Roadster and immediately fell in love with it. Jack and the owner of the car, a fellow officer, became friends while stationed there. Jack loved the car and got to drive it on occasions. He offered to buy the car when it was time for his friend to return to the States. The owner wanted \$500.00 for the car and after a few days of haggling, they settled on \$250.00 and a promise that Jack would drive him to the train station the day he was to leave Munich.

When it was Jack's time to leave Munich, he started looking for ways to bring the car back with him. There was no way he was leaving Germany without that car! As he was getting all of the paperwork together to ship the car and talking to other officers, he found out that if he brought the car to the loading dock with all of the correct papers and left two cartons of cigarettes on the seat, that miraculously, the car would be loaded! When the day came to load the car on the ship, Jack was there early in the morning, paperwork in hand and two cartons of cigarettes resting on the seat. He watched as they unceremoniously loaded the car until it disappeared from his view.

He would just have to wait to be re-united with it again. A few days after arriving back in the States, Jack was once again driving the 170V roadster. Upon seeing the car for the first time, Jack's wife, Doris, promptly named it "Roscoe" because it reminded her of a school mate they knew. So, "Roscoe" it was and "Roscoe" it will always be according to Jack's niece, Susan Van Stavern, who inherited the car from Jack.

It was Jack's daily driver until 1960. It was looking kind of sad and just needed too many things done to it to keep it running safely. It sat in several borrowed garages of family members until the early 80s when Jack decided to have it restored and painted back to the original colors.



Jack loved driving "Roscoe" to car shows and MBCA events and even bragged one time about beating a fellow member who owned a Gullwing!

Now Jack's passion for "Roscoe" has been taken up by Susan, who is in the process of getting "Roscoe" to his new home in Virginia and is joining the MBCA! She can't wait to drive and show "Roscoe". Now it is her time to love and care for her prized possession.

Meet "Roscoe" (1938 Mercedes-Benz 170 V Roadster)

The Mercedes-Benz W136 was Mercedes-Benz's line of inline-four cylinder automobiles from the mid-1930s into the 1950s. The model 170 V made its public debut in February 1936. Between 1936 and 1939 it was Mercedes' top selling model. Between 1936 and 1942 over 75,000 were built making it by far the most popular Mercedes-Benz up till that point.

However, the 2-door roadster was very rare with only 271 built between 1936 and 1940 and is now one of the rarest Mercedes-Benz models available for collection. In 1938 only 73 were built, one of which was Roscoe. It is an excellent example of the beautiful workmanship that went into these classic roadsters. In its day the roadster was an attractive, light automobile, which was much in demand by the members of high society and especially young ladies.

The 1.7 liter 4-cylinder engine provides a moderate 38 hp and as a lightweight car the roadster performs well with a top speed of over 60 mph. Roscoe is a true sports car, easy to handle, and uncomplicated. It has been used for outings in near vicinity and with friends at local rallies.

The cockpit amazes with its fine details like the instrument-panel and the fine quality of trim. The handling is very light and agile. It is a lovely, high-quality motorcar. The extremely rare 170 V with roadster coachwork is a very precious item within Mercedes-Benz automotive history. After 1940, it never returned in that form and represents one of the most charming members of the German light sports car. Roscoe may be the only one you will ever see.



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CLASSIC MERCEDES-BENZ

Classic Mercedes-Benzes have always interested me. About 15 years ago I began a casual search for a car to buy. That search ended in 2015 when I bought my first classic Mercedes-Benz, a 1990 300GE imported from the Netherlands, sight unseen. I like it so much I am never planning on selling it! I was pleased to receive a second-place award for my picture of it in the 4x4 category in the first virtual car show).

Knowing about my growing passion for Mercedes-Benz, in February 2017, my cousin Daniel called me to tell me about a Mercedes-Benz he had come across. Daniel builds custom furniture, and was talking to a couple living about 20 minutes from my house who wanted a custom kitchen. They mentioned to him that before moving forward with the project, they needed to sell the "old Mercedes in the garage."

Daniel got the details that it was a 1985 380SL roadster for sale for not a lot of money, and immediately called me to see if I was interested. Knowing it was an R107, I was expecting it to be neglected like a lot of them have been.

But it was close to my house and I'm always up for seeing an old Mercedes. My girlfriend Liz and I went to see the car, money in hand in the unlikely event it panned out. The owner opened the door to his garage, and among the boxes and disused workout equipment was a dusty but immaculate Diamond-Blue Metallic 380SL. The gentleman told me that he had bought the car almost three years earlier for his wife's 50th birthday present, and she had driven it only once or twice since. It was on only its second tank of (ethanol-free) fuel since they had it. For its condition and only 64,000 miles on the odometer, the price was more than fair, so I immediately offered him cash for what he was asking.

My plan at the time was simply to fix a few things and flip the car; I just wanted to help my cousin get the job! Liz had the honor of the debut drive back to my house.

Liz enjoyed the drive home, so I had to drive it myself. We went to my parents to show them. My mom knew of my original plan to flip it, but when she looked at our smiles, she said, "Don't name it or you will get attached to it." It was already too late for that. Within 24 hours, I named the car "Mary Ann" after my grandmother, who taught me that class never goes out of style. I knew a few things that would need some attention. After all, the car is more than 30 years old and it had been sitting for three years. In addition to replacing all fluids, we also replaced the shocks, motor mounts and subframe mounts mostly because of worn bushings, but in all other respects Mary Ann has been completely reliable.

I'm a little bit obsessive about the appearance of my cars, so I also removed the headlight surrounds and other trim pieces to restore the original luster. I carefully detailed the engine and replaced the discolored coolant bottle with a new white one. I even carefully painted the dark blue around the laurel on the original hood emblem. I also made some subtle changes in the styling, tucking the big U.S. bumpers back two inches and reworked the rubber bumper ends so that they wouldn't extend past the wheel opening. Most people think it's stock, but I think it looks better than other U.S. R107s.

I'm just lucky that a couple who owned one of these cars wanted a custom kitchen instead and called my cousin.
